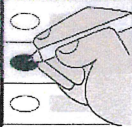


COMPOSITE BALLOT

General and Special Election - November 03, 2026

	To Vote:	Warning
	1. Use Black or Blue Ink to mark the ballot.	Do <u>NOT</u> use red ink or felt tip pen to mark ballot.
	2. Completely fill in the empty oval to the right of the candidate name or choice in all races you wish to vote.	Do <u>NOT</u> circle, underline or mark through choices.
	3. If voting for a Write-In candidate, completely fill in the oval to the right of the Write-In selection, then write the name of the Write-In candidate in the space provided.	Do <u>NOT</u> use check marks or X to mark ballot.
		Do <u>NOT</u> mark more choices per race than allowed.
		Do <u>NOT</u> sign, cut, tear or damage the ballot.

If you make a mistake or change your mind on a selection:

- A. Do not attempt to mark through the selection or attempt to erase. Write "Spoiled" across the ballot AND across the return envelope.
B. Mail or return the spoiled ballot and envelope to your county board of registrars; a new official absentee ballot will be mailed to you.

If you decide to vote in-person: Surrender the ballot to the poll manager at an early voting site within your county or the precinct to which you are assigned. You will then be permitted to vote a regular ballot.

Proposed Constitutional Amendments	Special Election
- 1 - Increases the maximum qualifying acreage for assessment and taxation as bona fide conservation use property. House Resolution 32 Ga. L. 2025, p. 1081 "Shall the Constitution of Georgia, for the purpose of protecting family farmland, be amended so as to increase the maximum acreage to qualify for assessment and taxation as a bona fide conservation use property from 2,000 acres to 4,000 acres?" Yes ☐ No ☐	County 1% Sales and Use Tax (Vote for One) Shall a special one percent sales and use tax be imposed in Spalding County for a period of time not to exceed 24 calendar quarters and for the raising of an estimated amount of \$134,000,000 for the purpose of funding the following capital outlay projects: (i) for Spalding County (A) transportation projects to include roads, streets, bridges, sidewalks, and trails, (B) County park deferred maintenance, (C) a new facility for E911 and acquisition of NextGen 911 software, (D) debt reduction for fire truck engines and ladder trucks for the Fire Department, (E) building maintenance renovations and update for Public Works, (F) County annex renovations, (G) elections office renovations, (H) collection centers and equipment and vehicles for Solid Waste, (I) sewer improvements and expansion for economic development, (J) maintenance shop update and new fueling station for county fleet and (K) equipment and vehicles for Storm Water Department; (ii) for the City of Griffin (A) acquisition and construction of new fire stations, including fire station equipment, (B) public safety equipment, (C) nuisance abatement for community development, and (D) transportation projects to include roads, streets, bridges, sidewalks, and parking; (iii) and for Orchard Hill, (A) improvements to City parks including a walking track, pickleball courts, and shades for playground equipment, (B) acquisition of new City property, and (C) inter-City improvements? If imposition of the tax is approved by the voters, such vote shall also constitute approval of the issuance of general obligation debt of the City of Griffin in a principal amount not to exceed \$20,000,000 for a portion of the above described capital outlay projects of the City of Griffin.
